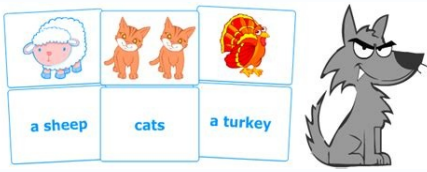
Infinitives and Infinitive Phrases

An **infinitive** is a verb form that can be used as a noun, an adjective, or an adverb. Most infinitives begin with *to*.

Writing Complete Sentences

A sentence is a complete thought that is made up of a subject and a predicate.

The **subject** tells who or what the sentence is about.

The **predicate** tells what the subject is or does.

The **simple subject** is just the noun or pronoun.

The **complete subject** is the noun or pronoun and its modifiers.

The **simple predicate** is just the verb.

The complete predicate is the verb and its modifiers.

The spotted green frog jumped into the pond.

Types of Sentences

Simple

A simple sentence contains a subject and a predicate. This is called an independent clause.

The spotted green frog jumped into the pond.

Compound

A compound sentence contains two or more independent clauses joined by a coordinating conjunction.

The spotted green frog jumped into the pond, and he splashed water on me.

Complex

A complex sentence has an independent clause and a dependent clause.

When the hawk flew overhead,
the spotted green frog jumped
into the pond.

The clause can act as the subject or object of the verb. It can also act as the object of a preposition. Identify the noun clauses in the following sentences.
